Ms. Schmid announced the passing of Janet Pellichero, Recycling Coordinator for West Windsor Township today.

PUBLIC COMMENT

<u>Ms. Teresa Laurenco, 408 South Post Road</u>, requested that the Township oppose the development of Dam Site 21 in Mercer County Park. She urged everyone to go on-line and sign the petition and to attend the meeting being held by the Mercer County Park Commission on November 12th at Mercer County Community College.

Mr. Wade Wilson, advised he had no permanent address, noted his concern that he was unable to find any chicken chimichangas in West Windsor. He asked the Council to rectify this matter.

Ms. Andrea Mandel, 46 Ellsworth Drive, Vice Chair of the West Windsor Environmental Commission, and Environmental Commission Planning Board Representative, noted that the Township received word today that they were awarded the Sustainable Jersey Silver Certification. She also urged residents to attend the November 7th, Zoning Board of Adjustment meeting.

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<u>Mr. Mike Hornsby, 978 Alexander Road</u>, explained the benefits of allowing the Princeton Junction Volunteer Fire Company to install a ground mounted solar array behind the fire house. He thanked the Council for their support of the project.

Ms. Latoya Edwards, ______, noted her concern about the intersection of Meadowbrook Road and Robbinsville-Edinburg Road and the numerous accidents that occur there. She requested additional signage be provided in this area along with a possible speed bump.

Mr. Lawrence Katz, 14 Orleans Street, Chair of the West Windsor Environmental Commission, noted his support for the ground mounted solar array for the Princeton Junction Volunteer Fire Company.

Mr. Don Watrous, 131 Cranbury Road, noted his concern with not getting timely updates on the Cranbury Road Sidewalk Project from the Township.

<u>Mr. John Hinsdale, 38 Quaker Road</u>, advised that he does not agree with the speaker at the last Council meeting that suggested everyone in West Windsor exercise their 2nd Amendment rights to arm themselves. He provided several reasons why this is not necessary in West Windsor.

ADMINISTRATION COMMENTS

Ms. Schmid made the following announcements:

- Alexander Road Bridge Replacement starts on November 6th, 2019
- Reminded Residents to sign-up for Nixle alerts
- Municipal Offices will be closed on November 11, 2019
- Veterans Day Ceremony is on November 11, 2019 starting at 11:00 a.m.
- There will be garbage collection on November 11th as usual.

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COUNCIL MEMBER COMMENTS

Ms. Manzari advised that she has been following the Dam Site 21 proposed development along with the Mayor and that she is drafting a resolution for Council action on the matter. She congratulated everyone who was involved in once again receiving the Silver Certification from Sustainable Jersey. Ms. Manzari requested that Resolution 2019-R236 be moved forward on the agenda.

Ms. Hamilton noted her support and is thrilled to hear that the Princeton Junction Volunteer Fire Company is moving in the right direction installing solar energy at their building. She thanked Mr. Katz as the Chair of the West Windsor Environmental Commission for their endorsement of the project.

Ms. Geevers thanked everyone who was involved in achieving the Silver Certification from Sustainable Jersey. She noted her support for a resolution regarding Dam Site 21 proposed improvements and thanked Ms. Laurenco for her comments this evening on the matter. Ms. Geevers thanked Ms. Edwards and advised that the Township is working on the matter as well. She extended her sympathies to the family of Janet Pellichero.

Mr. Zhang congratulated the West Windsor Environmental Commission on their achievement of receiving the Silver Certification and echoed his support as well for the Princeton Junction Volunteer Fire Company's solar project and thanked them for being here this evening.

CHAIR/CLERK COMMENTS

President Miller extended her sympathies to Janet Pellichero's family for their loss. She thanked the West Windsor Environmental Commission members for again receiving the Silver Certification from Sustainable Jersey. President Miller agreed with Ms. Laurenco that the Mercer County Park Commission should reach out to residents in the area to get their input before moving forward with park improvements.

Township Clerk Huber reminded everyone that the General Election is scheduled for Tuesday, November 5th and that the polls will be open from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Ms. Kathy Brennan, 1 Courtney Drive, requested that the Township consider adding sidewalks between Clarksville Road and the Township entrance during this renovation. She also noted that

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something should be done with the Censoni house and that previously she had been told that the police need additional evidence space. Ms. Brennan also noted her concerns with the lack of landscaping behind the post office facility.

2019-34 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER 148, "SOLID WASTE" ADDING ARTICLE IV SINGLE-USE PLASTIC BAG REDUCTION OF THE CODE OF WEST WINDSOR TOWNSHIP

President Miller opened the Public Hearing.

Ms. Rimma Yakobovich, 46 Saratoga Drive, noted her opposition to the proposed ordinance and her concerns with how this will affect local businesses and consumers.

Mr. Michael Rosenberg, 46 Saratoga Drive, noted his opposition to the proposed ordinance and feels that this item should be brought to a referendum for everyone to vote on.

<u>Ms. Corinna Bisgaier, 7 Villa Driv</u>e, noted her support of the proposed ordinance and encouraged Council to join the other municipalities in New Jersey who have already passed similar ordinances.

Ms. Tirza Wahrman, 5 Stonelea Drive, advised that merchants were some of the first people that she contacted earlier this year and that none of them had a problem with the ordinance. She

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urged Council to take action this evening. Ms. Wahrman noted this is about changing people's behaviors.

Ms. Maura Toomey, Representative of Clean Water New Jersey, noted that her organization is in favor of this ordinance and urges the Council to move forward. She echoes the last speakers comments whereby this is a behavioral change.

Ms. Jennifer Coffey, Executive Director Association of New Jersey Environmental Commissions (ANJEC), advised that ANJEC supports municipalities moving forward with this type of ordinance. She noted to date there have been 91 municipalities/counties that have passed similar plastic ban ordinances. Ms. Coffey encouraged the Council to move forward with voting yes for this plastic bag ban ordinance.

<u>Ms. Kristin Epstein, 11 Madison Drive</u>, advised that we should all go by reduce, reuse, and recycle. She provided information on how these bags promote contaminants in water and that this is the first step in making our waterways safe. Ms. Epstein noted her support for the ordinance.

Mr. Larry Katz, 14 Orleans Street, noted this is a global problem and that education is needed and that banning plastic bags is the easiest way to start. He advised that Trader Joes which is located in West Windsor banned the use of plastic bags a year ago.

Mr. Mike Pisavro, Representative of Stony Brook Millstone Watershed, thanked the Council for introducing the ordinance and that he can attest to the problems plastic bags have on waterways throughout New Jersey. He advised Council that they have the power to enact this ordinance and that to the best of his knowledge no challenges have occurred in any town that has passed such an ordinance. Mr. Pisavro encouraged Council to pass the ordinance.

<u>Mr. DJ Varner, 13 Amherst Way</u>, noted his support of the plastic bag ban ordinance and showed how many plastic bags he picked up on a run. Mr. Varner asked Council to act on this ordinance so higher levels of government will see what is happening and join in the movement.

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<u>Ms. Betty Sterling, 19 Chestnut Street, Princeton</u>, explained that on average every person in New Jersey uses 500 single use bags per year. She advised that these bags do not degrade and are contaminating our environment. Ms. Sterling noted that by West Windsor passing this ordinance other Mercer County municipalities will follow. She noted her support for Council to approve the ordinance.

Mr. Lawrence Jiang, 112 South Longfellow Drive, provided his support again for the plastic bag ban and encouraged Council to move forward to help future generations.

Ms. Yang Mei Wang, 41 Montgomery Street, advised that West Windsor Friends of Open Space collected 400 pounds of trash recently along Clarksville Road much of it was plastic bags. She supports the ordinance and the per bag charge.

<u>Ms. Sunita Mookerjee, 38 Renfield Drive</u>, noted her support for the ordinance and advised that recycling costs are on the rise throughout the Country. She read a statement into the record from several students encouraging the Council to move forward on this matter.

Ms. Shin-Yi Lin, 8 Harrison Lane, noted her support for the ordinance and encouraged Council members to enact this ordinance just like they did the "No Smoking" on public property recently.

Mr. Jerome Keeler, 252 Varsity Avenue, supports moving forward with this plastic bag ban and encouraged the Council to move it forward.

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Motion to adopt: Zhang Second: Hamilton

Ms. Geevers advised that she has always felt that Council should have gone through the ordinance line by line and voiced her concerns that local businesses were not made part of the process.

She made the following observations/suggestions:

- references should be stated in the "Whereas" clauses
- typo in annual should be annually
- under "food service establishments" definition had food trucks and mobile carts in an earlier draft and would like to see them put back in
- says reusable bags should be at least 10 mils thick most other ordinances have less mils
- why is the West Windsor Community Farmers Market the only farm exempt

Mr. Herbert advised that farmers fall under the "right to farm" act and that further research would need to be done.

Ms. Manzari noted her objection to only including the West Windsor Community Farmers Market. She suggested that the West Windsor Community Farmers Market be removed from this section.

Motion to remove the West Windsor Community Farmers Market as an exemption under Section 148-25 Definitions (a)6: Manzari Second: Geevers RCV: <u>aye</u> Geevers <u>NAY</u> Hamilton <u>aye</u> Manzari Zhang - abstain <u>NAY</u> Miller

Mr. Herbert advised that again, he must state that this could fall under the "right to farm" act and could make the ordinance null and void.

Ms. Geevers noted her concerns about "food deliveries" being included.

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Ms. Hamilton advised that most food delivery services are not using plastic bags.

Discussion ensued regarding delivery of food.

Ms. Manzari suggested having this section removed.

Motion to remove under 148-26 "These prohibitions apply to single use plastic carry-out bags used for take-out and/or deliveries from retail establishments or stores within West Windsor Township.": Manzari Second: Geevers RCV: <u>aye</u> Geevers <u>NAY</u> Hamilton <u>aye</u> Manzari <u>NAY</u> Zhang <u>NAY</u> Miller

Ms. Hamilton requested to place the ten cent per bag section removed from the ordinance at introduction back into the ordinance.

Discussion ensued regarding how this works but no vote was taken at this time for this section to be placed back into the ordinance.

Ms. Geevers noted her concerns with 148-30 "Temporary Exemptions".

Discussion ensued on how to change this section.

Motion to review the entire section 148-30 "Temporary Exemptions": Manzari Second: Geevers RCV: aye Geevers <u>NAY</u> Hamilton <u>aye</u> Manzari <u>NAY</u> Zhang <u>NAY</u> Miller

Ms. Geevers noted her concern with "Enforcement" being changed to "Compliance Assistance".

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Motion to change to "Enforcement": Manzari Second: Geevers RCV: <u>aye</u> Geevers <u>NAY</u> Hamilton <u>aye</u> Manzari <u>aye</u> Zhang NAY Miller

Ms. Geevers advised that we have not discussed the title of "Property Maintenance Officer" and that this position doesn't currently exist.

Ms. Hamilton noted that just because this position currently doesn't exist it doesn't make the ordinance invalid.

Ms. Manzari expressed her concerns on the fiduciary responsibilities that Council has to the residents of the Township and that you can't just say it's not our responsibility.

Ms. Geevers noted that fines in her opinion will not cover the costs for this ordinance.

Mr. Zhang advised that it will be up to Administration to enforce this ordinance. They will have to come back to the Council if amendments are needed. He noted that the residents will provide feed-back information to the Township.

Ms. Hamilton expressed her opinion that reusable bags are available from most businesses in town and that we should move forward.

Ms. Geevers inquired why there are two different effective dates in the ordinances.

President Miller advised it was the proposal we received.

Discussion again ensued with inquiries about how facilities that fall under both categories are going to be handled and what effective date they would fall under.

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Motion to change all effective dates for the ordinance to November 1, 2020: Manzari Second: Geevers RCV: <u>aye</u> Geevers <u>NAY</u> Hamilton <u>aye</u> Manzari <u>NAY</u> Zhang <u>aye</u> Miller

Motion to add food trucks and mobile food carts back into food establishment section: Geevers Second: Manzari RCV: aye Geevers <u>NAY</u> Hamilton aye Manzari <u>NAY</u> Zhang <u>NAY</u> Miller

Ms. Manzari advised that she has heard repeatedly from people that these are not "single use bags" and she would like it removed from the entire ordinance.

Discussion ensued among members of Council and Mr. Herbert as to what the definition is of a "single use plastic bag".

Motion to remove single use bags throughout the ordinance: Manzari.

There was no second to the motion.

Ms. Manzari also requested that in the second "Whereas" to remove the numbers that don't add up and make the change to 4.4 billion in New Jersey: Manzari Second: Miller RCV: <u>aye</u> Geevers <u>aye</u> Hamilton <u>aye</u> Manzari <u>aye</u> Zhang <u>aye</u> Miller

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Ms. Manzari requested that the third "Whereas" should be reworded with correct wordage. She advised that she researched how plastic bags are made and found out they are from natural gas (ethaline), which if not used to make plastic bags will off gas and increase greenhouse admissions.

Ms. Hamilton inquired if Ms. Manzari would like the "Whereas" clause removed.

Motion to reword the "Whereas" clause which starts with twelve million barrels" with her ethaline wordage: Manzari Second: Geevers RCV: <u>aye</u> Geevers <u>NAY</u> Hamilton <u>aye</u> Manzari NAY Zhang
