SALUTE TO THE FLAG

Ms. Huber led the salute to the flag.

CEREMONIAL MATTERS AND/OR TOPIC FOR PRIORITY CONSIDERATION

Proclamation on Autism Awareness was presented to Mr. Ryan Sinkleris and Mr. Andrew Sinkleris by the Township Council and Mayor Marathe.

Chief Garafalo spoke about how because of the Sinkleris family his officers are better prepared when encountering someone with autism.

Mr. Andrew Sinkleris and Mr. Ryan Sinkleris provided a short presentation on how to approach someone with autism and why it is important for people to understand the difference that exist.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Paul O'Keefe, 7 Perry Drive, noted that when he purchased his home a year and half ago he knew that he would have to replace his septic system.

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Ms. Paual Garg, 2 Duxbury Court, expressed her opinion on the need to have sewer installed in her area and how it is hard to sell a home without septic.

Ms. Huber read the following e-mails into the record. These emails will be made part of the permanent record.

Mr. & Mrs. Paul Adair, 8 Barrington Drive, noted they are not in favor of moving forward with the sewer in their area.

Mr. & Mrs. Byram Daruwala, 12 Perry Drive, noted they live in the King's Mill development and are opposed to having their area sewered.

Mr. Abhinav Singh, 3 Dean Court, noted that he strongly opposes the construction of sewer lines in his area.

Uma Chellam & Raghusri Sankaran, 27 Abbington Drive, noted that there is a group of residents that strongly oppose the installation of sewer in their neighborhoods.

Paul Ligeti and Katie Stokel, 2 Sleepy Hollow Drive, expressed their opinion that this is not the time for the Township to be engaging in the possible installation of sewer lines.

Vinod Agarwal, 4 Douglas Drive, noted that he is in favor of moving the sewer project forward in his area.

Mr. Ram Palagummi, 3 Wynwood Drive, provided his rationale for moving the sewer project forward in his area.

Ms. Andrea Panaggio, 5 Tindall Trail, noted her opposition to the sewer project in her neighborhood.

Ms. Tara Kurumaddali, 3 Wynwood Drive, noted she believes the project should move forward and the engineering study completed to see the true cost per household for the upgrade from septic to sewer.

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ADMINISTRATION COMMENTS

UPDATE FROM MAYOR ON SEWERS

Mayor Marathe addressed several questions regarding the sewer survey process to date. He advised that a new survey will be conducted for the south side residents only and that he must receive at least an 80% positive vote of the 315 properties to proceed with the engineering study.

Discussion ensued between the members of Council and Mayor Marathe with regards to the sewer survey and how the process will proceed.

COUNCIL MEMBER COMMENTS

Mr. Stevens advised that he was proud to speak with a group of Boy Scouts via Zoom. He thanked all the employees who worked on the second survey and backup documents which are very concise.

Mr. Hersh thanked the Sinkleris's for their hard work making people aware of autism. He advised that 5,000 Families have reached 2,700 meals to those in need and noted that Ms. Gawas and her family are a great asset to the team. Mr. Hersh noted his disappointment in the sewer processes and the choices that have been made.

Ms. Geevers noted that she has met with several residents on the south side sewer matter and encouraged all residents of that area to respond to the survey. She thanked Ryan Sinkleris and his family for their presentation and for the police being so proactive to understand the differences in people.

Ms. Gawas wished everyone a Happy Spring and Autism Awareness Day. She thanked the Sinkleris's for their hard work on making people aware. Ms. Gawas thanked Mr. Hersh for his 5,000

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Families initiative and noted it is a wonderful lesson for her children and urged everyone to donate. She announced that a proclamation was presented to the Mercer Mask Project team for all their hard work making masks and gowns. Ms. Gawas urged residents of the sewer survey area to fill out and return the new survey when you receive it. She also thanked staff for all their hard work. She wished everyone Happy Holy days.

CHAIR/CLERK COMMENTS

President Mandel wished everyone Happy Holy Days. She advised that World Autism Day is April 2nd and noted how proud she is to see how involved the Police Division is regarding this subject. President Mandel advised it was great to present a proclamation to the Mercer Mask Project for all their hard work this past year. She advised that Council has had three budget meetings and will conduct one more on March 24th. President Mandel noted she attended the virtual Gala for the West Windsor Arts Council. She thanked all for their input on the sewer survey and thanked the Mayor and Staff for all their hard work on this project.

A short discussion ensued among Council members on the sewer process.

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ADDITIONAL PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. John Church, 11 Princeton Place, expressed his opinion on the sewer survey.

<u>Ms. Paugh Garg, 2 Duxbury Court</u>, noted in her opinion the two questions on the survey are confusing.

<u>Ms. Lisa Wolfe, 1 Partridge Run</u>, thanked Council and Mayor for meeting with the residents. She inquired why not make the survey binding and thanked all for the information provided. Ms. Wolfe requested that the survey be mailed out after Easter and that the due date be moved out till the end of May.

Mayor Marathe advised that the surveys will only be counted after the deadline. He advised that four weeks should be enough time for residents to return their survey.

Mr. Irving Zatz, 8 Huntingdon Drive, thanked Council and the Mayor for meeting with them and requested that this survey be made binding. He too requested additional time for residents to return the surveys. Mr. Zatz suggested that the addresses be verified before sending out surveys.

<u>Mr. Ram Palagummi, 3 Wynwood Drive</u>, thanked Council and the Mayor for meeting with them and made several suggestions to include: extending the timeframe, place the wording "nonbinding" at the top of the survey; and to make it clear not to submit via e-mail.

<u>Ms. Judi Strober, 5 Quail Ridge</u>, requested clarity with the survey as to whether it is binding or non-binding and thanked the Mayor and Council for meeting with them.

Mr. Frank Lavadera, 4 Wynwood Drive, thanked all you attended the meeting and noted he agrees that the current wording implies its binding.

Mr. David Katz, 23 Remington Circle, expressed his concerns that this procedure does not generate confidence in government.

Mayor Marathe addressed the concerns of the residents.

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COUNCIL REPORTS/DISCUSSION TOPICS/NEW BUSINESS

Ms. Gawas reported that she attended the West Windsor Parking Authority meeting on March 10^{th} and that they reviewed the additional costs they have had to incur during the pandemic.

Ms. Geevers noted that the Planning Board discussed the draft circulation plan Element as part of the Master Plan and discussed an application for the Marketfair for a minor site plan extension. She noted she was not in attendance at these meetings.

Mr. Hersh advised that the Board of Recreation Commissioners approved the purchase of movie equipment. He provided an update on the "War of the Worlds" event scheduled for later this year and formally requested that the \$7,500.00 in Administration's budget for Community Day be reallocated for the "War of the Worlds" event. Mr. Hersh advised that the West Windsor-Plainsboro School District is conducting a survey for students to come back to in-person classes. He noted that the school district will be conducting budget hearings soon. Mr. Hersh provided his opinion on the sewer survey process.

Mr. Stevens advised that Public Safety will be meeting in April.

President Mandel reported that the Environmental Commission will be working on rain gardens and she attended the March 10th Planning Board meeting and they worked on the circulation plan element to the master plan and had a discussion of the Ward Road extension.

Dear Mayor Marathe, Council Members and Township Clerk,

We are writing to express our personal preference not to move forward with the current Sewer project for our Brookshyre II neighborhood.

Through no fault of our own, in September 2018, we learned that our Leach Field had failed, the Distribution Box was in need of replacement and there was a hole in the center wall of our Septic Tank. We immediately set out to fix our system. Unfortunately, Excavators in this area are always busy. We therefore learned, the process of interviewing Excavators, aligning Engineering plans, and securing permits and inspections can be a very lengthy process.

After approximately 18 months, in Spring 2020, our project was finally complete. We spent slightly less than \$30,000 to bring our system to working order and up to township code.

It is with much disappointment that we now face the possibility of spending an additional estimated sum of \$30,000 - \$50,000 if this sewer project is approved. We do not feel that the value added to our home would be anywhere close to the \$60,000 - \$80,000 that would be our estimated personal expense of both the recent repair + the new sewer hook-up.

Please consider the hardship that this situation would place on us and other township residents in the same position.

Dear Ms. Huber:

My name is Ram Palagummi. I request that you consider this email as my public comment for the township's council meeting on Monday, March 22, 2021. I currently reside at 3 Wynwood Drive, West Windsor Twp.

In response to the township's septic-sewer survey results that are posted on the township's website - Support for the Bear Brook Septic to Sewer Study is far higher now than it was 10 yrs ago. Support for the Study has been overwhelmingly positive from the homeowners that are on South of 571 (the "South Block"). Princeton Oaks (our community), Windsor Ridge, Westminster Estates, Shadow Oaks within the South Block are all clustered together and are quite eager to get the Study done - this can be clearly seen from the survey results. To put the South Block results in numbers:

- 313 total properties on the South Block
- 241 homeowners responded in good faith to the survey i.e. 78% of the total South Block responded
- 78% of the total South Block survey respondents voted YES for the study.

So far, the Mayor has been unwilling to consider a study for the South Block despite a vast number of homeowners have voted to have an engineering study done. The Mayor and his team have not defined clear parameters such as defined deadlines, threshold percentage of YES votes, near-actual estimates for the South properties. The township's FAQs clearly specify that "The Council and Mayor will determine the threshold for sufficient engagement by the public to move forward on the engineering concepts study project.". Despite this, there is no indication that the Mayor has formally consulted and conferred with the council members to define a clear threshold for approving a study whether it is before the surveys were mailed out or during the survey intake process.

We request that the council and the Mayor work together in approving a sewer study for the South Block only with the current overwhelming mandate that they have in front of them. In the alternative, we request that the surveys acceptance be reopened by the township by giving abundant amount of time and defining clear threshold percentage that is fair and reasonable. Defining a very high threshold that virtually insurmountable means the survey is going to be designed and drafted with a singular intent that it fails. And counting Non-Responders as NO votes is not founded on any democratic values or principles that any of us ever heard of.

Sewers are an advancement over Septic from all aspects - financially speaking - one time sewer conversion vs recurring septic repairs/replacements, improvement in property values, larger pool of buyers for sewer properties over septic, and even from an environmental standpoint. Several studies have shown that effluent discharge from septic systems is likely to go into the ground water and cause contamination with various dangerous substances including, but not limited to pharmaceuticals, bacteria and viruses among other substances. Thus, moving over to a sewer system is clean, financially-sound, and environmental-safe alternative to the archaic septic system concept.

Please approve an engineering study for the South Block without any further delay. Thank you.

Dear Ms. Huber:

My name is Tara Kurumaddali. Here is my public comment for the township's council meeting on Monday, March 22, 2021. I live at 3 Wynwood Drive, West Windsor Twp.

The Mayor does not want to consider approving an engineering study to know the costs of sewer conversion. What is the point of undertaking a sewer survey initiative if you do not want to order the study after receiving 78% of support for the study? It is beyond my comprehension that the Mayor is simply getting away with this anti-democratic decision to suppress the voice of the majority requesting an engineering study. Our septic systems are over 30 years old and deteriorating and failing. While the Mayor plays with the numbers and percentages and argues with people on what he wants to see in terms of percentages, it is important to stop for a moment to think that he has not clearly laid out what percentage he was expecting to say YES before ordering the study. If this does not sound like an unfair process to you, I do not know what will!

Imagine that if there is so much fuss about getting a study done which is our right to ask as taxpayers, what will happen once the study is approved and we move towards a binding vote. It appears like pulling teeth every step of the whole process.

We reasonably believed and relied on the information that the township stated in its frequently asked questions wherein the Mayor and council are to determine the threshold for approving a study. And we do not know if that was ever undertaken. I therefore request that the Mayor take reasonable and appropriate efforts to present the engineering study to the council for the South Block and I hope that the council approves it as expeditiously as possible.
